## MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Between

JAIN AGM AYURVEDIC MEDICAL COLLEGE AND HOSPITAL, VARUR

And

AGM COLLEGE OF PHARMACY, VARUR

### AUTHORITY FOR EXECUTION

This Memorandum of Understanding is executed by both institutions as per the directions and instructions of the **Management Committee of SDM Jain Matt Trust**, the parent governing body of both institutions. This MOU is entered into in furtherance of the Trust's vision of integrated, collaborative, and quality-driven health sciences education across its constituent colleges.

### PREAMBLE

This Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as "MOU") is entered into between:

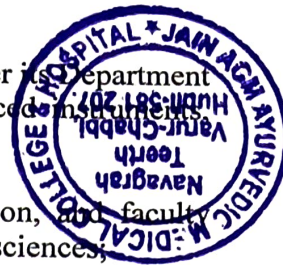
**Party A:** Jain AGM Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Varur, represented by its Principal (hereinafter referred to as "the Ayurveda College"), and

**Party B:** AGM College of Pharmacy, [Location], represented by its Principal (hereinafter referred to as "the Pharmacy College").

Both institutions are hereinafter collectively referred to as "the Parties" and individually as "a Party."

WHEREAS, both institutions are committed to the promotion of quality education, research, and professional development in the health sciences;

WHEREAS, the Ayurveda College houses a Quality Control Laboratory under its Department of Rasa Shastra and Bhaishajya Kalpana, which requires access to advanced instruments, equipment, and chemicals for academic and research purposes;



WHEREAS, the Pharmacy College possesses infrastructure, instrumentation, and faculty expertise relevant to quality control, pharmaceutical analysis, and laboratory sciences;

WHEREAS, both Parties recognise the mutual benefit of collaboration in academic, training, and resource-sharing activities;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein and in the spirit of inter-institutional cooperation, the Parties agree to the following terms and conditions:

## **ARTICLE 1 – OBJECTIVES OF THE MOU**

1.1 To facilitate the sharing of instruments, equipment, and chemicals available in the respective laboratories of both institutions, particularly for the Quality Control Laboratory of the Department of Rasa Shastra and Bhaishajya Kalpana of the Ayurveda College.

1.2 To enable the deputation of qualified faculty members from either institution for the purpose of training, demonstration, and maintenance of shared instruments and equipment.

1.3 To provide structured training opportunities to students of the Ayurveda College and students of the Pharmacy College, as may be required under their respective curricula and regulatory guidelines.

1.4 To foster a spirit of academic exchange, mutual learning, and collaborative growth between the two institutions.

## **ARTICLE 2 – SCOPE OF COLLABORATION**

### **2.1 Sharing of Instruments, Equipment, and Chemicals**

2.1.1 Both Parties agree to share, on a need-based and mutually agreed basis, the following categories of resources:

- Analytical instruments (e.g., UV-Vis Spectrophotometer, HPTLC, Microscopes, pH meters, Muffle furnace, etc.)
- Glassware, consumables, and laboratory accessories
- Chemicals and reagents required for quality control testing of Ayurvedic formulations as per pharmacopoeial standards

2.1.2 Requests for the use of instruments or chemicals shall be made in writing (or via officially designated communication) at least [ ] working days in advance.

2.1.3 The lending institution shall ensure the equipment is in working condition prior to deputing it. The borrowing institution shall be responsible for the safe handling, care, and timely return of all borrowed items.

2.1.4 Any consumables used (chemicals, reagents, etc.) shall be replenished or reimbursed by the borrowing institution at actual cost, or as mutually agreed in writing.

2.1.5 In the event of damage, loss, or malfunction of equipment during use by the borrowing institution, the cost of repair or replacement shall be borne by the borrowing institution, unless otherwise agreed in writing.

## **2.2 Deputation of Faculty for Training and Maintenance**

2.2.1 Faculty members with relevant expertise may be deputed by either institution to the other for:

- Training of laboratory staff and students in the operation of instruments
- Demonstration of analytical and quality control procedures
- Preventive and corrective maintenance of shared equipment

2.2.2 The schedule of faculty deputation shall be planned jointly and documented in advance.

2.2.3 Honorarium, travel, and accommodation (if applicable) for deputed faculty shall be borne by the requesting institution, as mutually agreed at the time of request.

2.2.4 Deputed faculty shall abide by the rules and protocols of the host institution during their visit.

## **2.3 Student Training and Cross-Institutional Exposure**

2.3.1 Students of the Ayurveda College may be provided practical training at the Pharmacy College laboratories, and vice versa, as required by their respective curricula framed by the concerned regulatory bodies (NCISM, PCI, University, etc.).

2.3.2 The number of students, duration of training, and specific objectives shall be agreed upon and documented by both Parties at the beginning of each academic year or as and when required.

2.3.3 All students visiting the partner institution shall:

- Adhere to the academic calendar, dress code, and laboratory rules of the host institution
- Be supervised by a faculty member from their parent institution or the host institution, as mutually agreed
- Hold valid institutional identity cards during the visit

2.3.4 Responsibility for student insurance, conduct, and safety during cross-institutional visits shall be addressed jointly and documented separately if required.

## **ARTICLE 3 – RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE PARTIES**

**3.1 Jain AGM Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital (Party A) shall:**

a) Formally communicate its resource requirements (instruments, chemicals, faculty) with adequate notice. b) Ensure proper handling and safe return of all borrowed items. c) Replenish consumed chemicals and reagents promptly. d) Maintain a register of all borrowed instruments, equipment, and chemicals. e) Cooperate in scheduling and facilitating visits of Pharmacy College students for training. f) Facilitate faculty visits from the Pharmacy College as per agreed schedule.



### 3.2 AGM College of Pharmacy (Party B) shall:

a) Make available, to the extent possible, instruments, equipment, chemicals, and faculty expertise as requested. b) Ensure equipment is in good working condition prior to sharing. c) Provide a safe, equipped, and supervised environment for visiting students from the Ayurveda College. d) Maintain a reciprocal register of all shared items and faculty deputed. e) Cooperate in scheduling and facilitating student training visits.

## ARTICLE 4 – COORDINATION AND COMMUNICATION

4.1 Each institution shall designate a **MOU Coordinator** (a senior faculty member or administrator) who shall serve as the primary point of contact for all matters arising from this MOU.

4.2 The Coordinators shall meet at least once per academic year (or more frequently, as required) to review the functioning of this MOU, resolve operational issues, and plan activities for the forthcoming period.

4.3 All formal communications shall be addressed to the respective Principals, with copies to the designated Coordinators.



## **ARTICLE 5 – FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS**

5.1 This MOU is essentially a non-financial, goodwill-based academic collaboration. Neither Party shall charge institutional fees for the use of each other's facilities under this MOU for consumables and costs explicitly agreed upon in writing.

5.2 Any financial arrangement necessitated by specific activities (e.g., faculty honorarium, student transport, consumable replenishment) shall be settled on an activity-specific basis as mutually agreed, and shall be documented.

5.3 Neither Party shall use this MOU as a basis for financial liability of any kind beyond what is explicitly agreed in writing.

## **ARTICLE 6 – INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY AND CONFIDENTIALITY**

6.1 Any data, formulations, research outputs, or proprietary methodologies shared between the Parties in the course of collaboration under this MOU shall not be disclosed to third parties without the prior written consent of the originating institution.

6.2 Academic outputs (publications, presentations, etc.) resulting from joint activities shall duly acknowledge both institutions.

6.3 Existing intellectual property of either Party shall remain the sole property of that Party and shall not be affected by this MOU.

## **ARTICLE 7 – DURATION AND RENEWAL**

7.1 This MOU shall come into force on the date of execution as mentioned above and shall remain valid for a period of **five (5) years** from that date.

7.2 This MOU may be renewed for a further period by mutual written consent of both Parties, preferably three months prior to the date of expiry.

7.3 The Parties shall conduct a formal review of this MOU at the end of each academic year to assess progress and make any necessary amendments by mutual written agreement.

## **ARTICLE 8 – AMENDMENT AND MODIFICATION**

8.1 Any amendment or modification to this MOU shall be made only by mutual written consent of both Parties, signed by the respective Principals.

8.2 Such amendments shall be recorded as Addenda to this MOU and shall form an integral part thereof.

## **ARTICLE 9 – TERMINATION**

9.1 Either Party may terminate this MOU by giving a written notice of **[60/90] days** to the other Party.

9.2 Upon termination, all borrowed instruments, equipment, and materials shall be returned within [30] days from the date of notice.

9.3 Obligations already undertaken at the time of notice shall be honoured in full unless mutually agreed otherwise.

9.4 Termination of this MOU shall not give rise to any financial claim or liability beyond what is already documented and agreed.

#### **ARTICLE 10 – DISPUTE RESOLUTION**

10.1 Any dispute or difference arising out of or in connection with this MOU shall first be resolved through mutual discussion and good faith negotiation between the Parties.

10.2 If the dispute is not resolved within [30] days of the initial notice, the matter shall be referred to a mediator acceptable to both Parties.

10.3 This MOU shall be governed by the laws of India, and jurisdiction shall vest with the courts of [Jurisdiction City/District], Karnataka.

#### **ARTICLE 11 – GENERAL CONDITIONS**

11.1 This MOU does not constitute a legal partnership, joint venture, agency, or employment relationship between the Parties.

11.2 Neither Party shall make any representation or commitment on behalf of the other Party without prior written consent.

11.3 This MOU supersedes all prior verbal or written understandings, if any, between the Parties on the subject matter herein.

11.4 This MOU is executed in two (2) originals, each Party retaining one copy of equal legal standing.

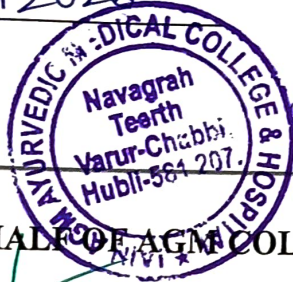

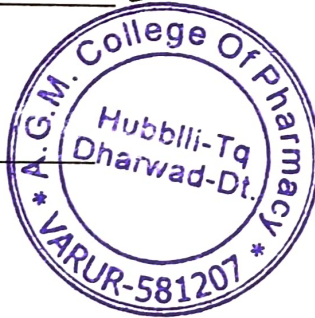
