Subject: Grant of Conditional Permission to Jain AGM Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Navagrah Teertha, NH4, Varur -Chabbi, Karnataka- 581207, (AYU0484) with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 for the academic session 2024-25 and issuance of Letter of permission (LOP) for increase in intake in capacity existing UG (BAMS) course from 60 seats to 100 seats and to start 03 new PG courses with 15 seats in subject namely- (i) Shayla tantra -05 seats, (ii) Kaya Chikitsa - 05 seats, (iii) Ayurveda Samhita and Siddhant -05 seats under section of 29 NCISM act 2020 for the academic session 2024-25 and relevant regulations thereunder-reg.

Sir,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that, in pursuance of the provisions of National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021 and With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 has been dissolved and as per section 59(2) of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 it is stated that, "Notwithstanding the repeal of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970, the Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made thereunder shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made thereunder:", The provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM ACT 2020 shall not be applicable.

1. I am. to refer to your application **vide ref.no. JAGMCH/870/2023, dated 29.09.2023 and JAGMCH/871/2023 dated 29.09.2023**, on the subject cited above and to verify the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff and other facilities available at your college namely **Jain AGM Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Navagrah Teertha, NH4, Varur -Chabbi, Karnataka- 581207, (AYU0484) for increase in intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 60 seats to 100 seats, and to start 03 new PG courses with 15 seats namely- (i) Shaylatantra -05 seats, (ii) KayaChikitsa - 05 seats, (iii) Ayurveda Samhita and Siddhant -05 seats, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 from the academic session 2024-25** visitation has been carried out for issuance of Letter of Intent (LOI)on **11.01.2024 & 12.01.2024 in hybrid mode** by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board (NCISM) and Letter of Intent (LOI) has been issued to your college vide letter of **even no. dated 09.02.2024 for increase in intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 60 seats to 100 seats and to start 03 new PG courses with 15 seats in subject namely- (i) Shalya tantra -05 seats, (ii) KayaChikitsa - 05 seats, (iii) Ayurveda Samhita and Siddhant -05 seats, under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020 from the academic session 2024-25.**
2. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) had carried out an inspection of the college again on **14.03.2024 and 15.03.2024 through Hybrid mode** to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities available as a part of annual visitation **for issuance of conditional permission for intake capacity with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2024-25** and for issuance of Letter of Permission **for increase in intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course for intake capacity from 60 seats to 100 seats and to start 03 new PG courses with 15 seats in subject namely- (i) Shalya tantra -05 seats, (ii) KayaChikitsa - 05 seats, (iii) Ayurveda Samhita and Siddhant -05 seats, from the academic session 2024-25 under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020.**

3. Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Post-graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016, All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2022, provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations thereunder.
4. Thereafter, the assessment report was placed in the **96th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on **05.07.2024**. On careful examination of the assessment report it is found that **your college is not fulfilling the notified & approved criteria. Hence, Board decided to ask for clarification for the sought document and a letter of even no. dated 18.07.2024 was sent to your college regarding the same. In response to which your college has submitted the asked document through an email dated 19.07.2024.**
5. Further, in accordance of the regulation **6 (2) (i) (i)** of "Establishment of New Medical College, Opening of New or Higher Course of Study or Training and Increase of Admission Capacity by a Medical College Regulations, 2019 and **6 (3) (j) (ii)** of "Establishment of New Medical College, Opening of New or Higher Course of Study or Training and Increase of Admission Capacity by a Medical College Regulations, 2019, a letter of even no. **dated 25.07.2024** was sent to the college to furnish fixed security deposit worth **Rupees 2 crore** for a period of three years and five years in favor of National Commission fund for Indian system of Medicine and . **In response of the same, the college has furnished the fixed security deposit of rupees 1 crore 50 lakh in favor of the National Commission fund for Indian system of Medicine through UTR No.037100466211/SBIN0010651/40244157, 037100604221/SBIN0010651/40244543 and 037100620351/SBIN0010651/40244421 transferred by ICICI Bank, Shiggaon, dated 30.07.2024 (for a period of three years) and fixed security deposit of rupees 50 lakh in favor of the National Commission fund for Indian system of Medicine through UTR No.037087452651/SBIN0010651/40195278, transferred by ICICI Bank, Shiggaon, dated 29.07.2024 (for a period of five years) and informed the same vide an email dated 30.07.2024 enclosing a letter vide ref. no. JAGMCH/MARBISM/1319/2024-25 dated 30.07.2024.**
6. Therefore, after verification of the sought document in the clarification letter and fixed security deposit, **Conditional Permission is granted to Jain AGM Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Navagrah Teertha, NH4, Varur -Chabbi, Karnataka- 581207, (AYU0484) with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2024-25 and Letter of Permission for increase in intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 60 seats to 100 seats and to start 03 new PG with 15 seats courses in subject namely- (i) Shayla tantra -05 seats, (ii) Kaya Chikitsa - 05 seats, (iii) Ayurveda Samhita and Siddhant -05 seats from the academic session 2024-25 under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder** subject to the condition that college is fulfilling the following requirements: -
 - i) The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the colleges/hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant rules and regulations.
 - ii) It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity **with 100 seats in UG** and that minimum 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted **15 Seats in 03 PG courses** shall be treated as All India Quota. The counseling for seats under All India Quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2023-24 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned counseling authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for All India Quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
 - iii) It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no.BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
7. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
8. Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of**

permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular or the subsequent academic year

9. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
10. **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2024 and compliance report should be sent to get permission for the academic session 2025-2026:**
 - i) All the requirement of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standard of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2022;
 - ii) All the requirements of minimum standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in MES (Assessment & Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda Colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - iii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Post-graduate Ayurveda Education)Regulations, 2016;
 - iv) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in to;
11. This permission for increase in intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 60 seats to 100 seats and to start 03 new PG courses from the academic session 2024-25 as stated above for the first admitted batch of 2024-25 session, will be valid till such time as the first batch of students admitted against these courses appear for the first final examination of the said courses and at that time, the College authorities may take up the matter for recognition of the qualifications under Section 35 of the NCISM Act 2020.
12. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2025-26.
