ID AYU0484) with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and 1st Renewal of Permission with 61 to 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 and 1st Renewal of Permission with 15 Seats in each 03 PG courses in the subjects namely i) Ayurved Samhita & siddhanta- 05 seats, (ii) Kayachikitsa-05 seats,(iii) Shalya Samanya - 05 seats,, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26 reg.

Sir/Madam,

- 1. To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college Jain AGM Ayurveda Medical College & Hospital, At/Post Navagrahateertha, N.H-4 Road, Varur-Chabbi-581207, Tq. Hubballi, Distt. Dharward, Karnataka (Inst. ID AYU0484), inspection was conducted on 08.04.2025 and 09.04.2025 in hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM to process the permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and 1st Renewal of Permission with 61 to 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 and 15 Seats in each 03 PG course in the subject namely i) Ayurved Samhita & siddhanta- 05 seats, (ii) Kayachikitsa-05 seats,(iii) Shalya Samanya -05 seats, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020.
2. The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024, Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for postgraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024 provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations there under. On careful examination of the assessment report following shortcomings/defects have been observed:-

i. For UG Course:-

Availability of total teaching staff for UG( BAMS) course as per the part 1 submitted by the college is
(33/45)x100% = 73.33% (Excluding Excess)

Shortcomings in teaching staff are as under :-

ii. **Hospital staffs :-**

- Availability of hospital staff is  $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{76}{81} \times 100\% = 93.82\%$ .

- On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above, an opportunity was given to your college to submit the clarification for the same vide the Boards letter (clarification letter) of even number dated **05.07.2025**. In response of the same the college submitted the clarification vide ref no. **JAGMCH/NCISM dated 08.07.2025** against the deficiencies conveyed to them.
- The assessment report along with clarification was duly placed in the **140<sup>th</sup> Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) convened on 12.08.2025** and Board observed that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the concerned acts and regulations but is fulfilling the criteria in accordance with the Board's policy letters issued on **09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025**. Further, the Board also observed that the college is not fulfilling the criteria for extended permission for UG in accordance with regulation 54(2) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024, as the Letter of Permission was issued to the college with intake capacity of 61 to 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course, for the academic year 2024-25; and also not fulfilling the criteria for extended permission for PG in accordance with regulation 45(3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024, as the Letter of Permission to start new PG was issued from the academic year 2024-25. Accordingly, the Board decided as follows:
  - To issue Yearly Permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) Course in accordance with regulation 54 (3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.
  - To issue 1<sup>st</sup> Renewal of Permission in UG (BAMS) course with intake capacity of 61 to 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course in accordance with Regulation 64 (2) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.
  - To issue 1<sup>st</sup> Renewal of Permission in 03 PG courses with 15 seats in subjects namely i) Ayurved Samhita & siddhanta- 05 seats, (ii) Kayachikitsa-05 seats,(iii) Shalya Samanya -05 seats, for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 45(3) of NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulation, 2024; under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.

**"DECISION"**

- Therefore, **Jain AGM Ayurveda Medical College & Hospital, At/Post Navagrahateertha, N.H-4 Road, Varur-Chabbi-581207, Tq. Hubballi, Distt. Dharward, Karnataka (Inst. ID AYU0484)** is hereby granted with :-

- i. Yearly Permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) Course in accordance with regulation 54 (3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.
  - ii. 1<sup>st</sup> Renewal of Permission in UG (BAMS) course with intake capacity of 61 to 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course in accordance with Regulation 64 (2) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.
  - iii. to issue 1<sup>st</sup> Renewal of Permission in 03 PG courses with 15 seats in subjects namely i) Ayurved Samhita & siddhanta- 05 seats, (ii) Kayachikitsa-05 seats,(iii) Shalya Samanya -05 seats, for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 45(3) of NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulation, 2024; under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.
6. The aforementioned permission is issued under section 28 & 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that following requirements shall be fulfilled:-
- I. It is further informed that minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 100 seats and minimum 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 15 Seats in 03 PG courses** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted there under.**
  - II. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
7. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations there under.
8. Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
9. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
10. **You are hereby instructed to comply with all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the Implementation letters vide. ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS. Dated 09.05.2024 & 06.09.2024 issued by the Board.**
11. **The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2025 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-**
- i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made there under should be fulfilled.
  - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
  - iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
  - iv) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024.
  - v) The shortcoming mentioned in Para no. 2 above, shall be fulfilled.
12. The College administration will ensure that sufficient qualified teachers and non-teaching staff in the college and requisite staff in the hospital, as per the NCISM ACT and relevant regulation thereunder, are in position before the admission of 2<sup>nd</sup> batch of students in 1<sup>st</sup> year PG are made under intimation to the Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM.

13. The college administration may take up the matter for recognition of the qualification under section 35 of the NCISM Act, 2020 at that time when the first batch of students admitted against this course appears for the first final professional examination of the said course.
14. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
